The Winter Vaccination Programme was brought forward following the

identification of a new variant of COVID-19. The people at greatest risk were offered their vaccines first, and some care home residents and housebound patients have already received their jabs.

Care home residents, as well as those patients who are housebound, were the first to start receiving their flu vaccination and COVID booster, along with frontline health and social care staff. All other eligible groups, such as people aged 65 and over and those with a weakened immune system, are now being

invited for theirs. Wherever possible, people will be able to have the flu jab at the same time as their COVID-19 booster.

GP practices are now contacting their patients to invite them to a vaccination clinic, but eligible people can also choose to have their vaccinations by making a booking at a local pharmacy.

You are now able to book your COVID booster by using the NHS website or by calling 119. For flu vaccinations from a pharmacy, please drop in to make an appointment. Please have your NHS number to hand when you go for your vaccinations.

Flu can be a very unpleasant illness in children and some may develop serious complications that need hospital treatment, including intensive care. Having the flu nasal spray is the best protection for children this winter. The spray is quick and painless, this can be done at the surgery for children under 3 or arranged by the school through the Locala nursing team.

Online Access to your records is now available

Owned and run by the NHS, the NHS App is a simple and secure way to access a range of NHS services on your smartphone or

tablet.. What can you do with the NHS App? You need to prove who you are to get full access to the NHS App. With full access you can:

Order repeat prescriptions and nominate a pharmacy where you would like to collect them; book and manage appointments; view your GP health record to see information like your allergies and medicines (if your GP has given you access to your detailed medical record, you can also see information like test results)

Book and manage coronavirus (COVID-19) vaccinations; get your NHS COVID Pass (there are also other ways to get your COVID Pass), register your organ donation decision, choose how the NHS uses your data, view your NHS number (find out what your NHS number is). Use NHS 111 online to answer questions and get instant advice or medical help near you

Instructions registering for the NHS App: Step 1 – Download the NHS App from Google Play or Apple App store. Step 2 – Click on “Continue with NHS login Step 3 – Enter your email address & password. Step 4 – Check your email and confirm. Step 5 – Enter your mobile number. You will be sent a Security code via text. Step 6 – Enter the code which has been sent via text to your mobile. Step 7 – You will be asked for your NHS Number. If yes, enter your NHS number. If no, you will be asked for your name, Date of Birth, and your Postcode. Step 8 – Confirm details. Step 9 – Read Terms & Conditions. Step 10 – To gain full access follow the steps to prove your identity. Please speak to reception if you do struggle to access your online account.
